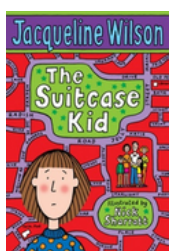


Brackenfield Reading Spine - Year 2

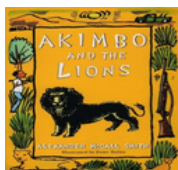
Hats for cats! Pet pigs for all! Banana shaped buses! Swimming pools on trains!

The story of a little girl with magical powers. When someone makes her angry she zaps a punishment on them with her magic flashing finger!



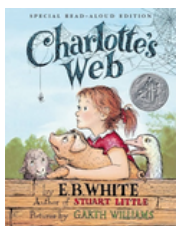
Super Cat by Jeanne Willis

But Tiger has a secret! Just one lick of a toxic sock and he transforms into... SUPERCAT!

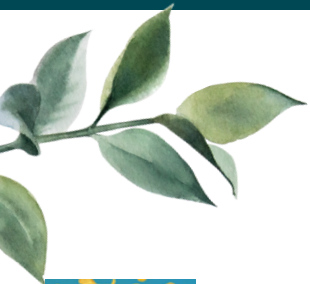
Now, with his astonishing powers and his best friend James, can Supercat save the world, and all the chips, from the dastardly Count Backwards...?

When the chips are down, there's only one cat to call!



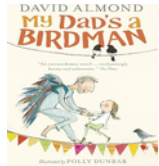
Charlotte's Web by EB White
